EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The nationally acclaimed, award winning Columbus Arts Festival is always the first weekend in June in Downtown Columbus.

	Sunday, June 6	11:30 AM – 6:00 PM

Location: Downtown Columbus is a combination of commercial, retail, colleges and residential in Ohio's capital city. The Discovery District is where art meets museums, colleges, conservatories, theaters and more. Boundary streets are Long Street, Washington Street, Ninth Street, Gay Street and Cleveland Avenue.

Features: Festival goers can choose from a variety of creative and original works of art including sculpture, painting, photography, woodcarvings, glasswork, jewelry, multimedia compositions, and more. Thousands of dollars of art is sold during the festival, ranging from one-of-a-kind art to quality. For the highly competitive juried art show, the festival receives over 1,000 applications from which an esteemed panel of judges selects 230 of the country's best artists. Enjoy food and drinks from great area restaurants and vendors, children's art activities and entertainment.

Attendance: An average of 400,000 people attend annually, making it one of the largest statewide events behind the Ohio State Fair.

HISTORY

2010 marks the 49th annual Columbus Arts Festival. Since its humble beginnings on the Statehouse lawn in 1961, the Festival has evolved into one of the largest and most prestigious visual arts festivals in the country.

Large community events such as the Columbus Arts Festival are important for many reasons. The Festival provides a positive outlet for the diverse elements of our city to come together. Downtown Columbus is everyone's neighborhood—a neutral zone where everyone feels at home. People from a broad cross section of the community in terms of background, age, education, career, ethnicity, etc., have an opportunity to experience great art, music and food. The Festival provides an atmosphere conducive to spontaneous conversations and shared opinions. It also helps to instill a sense of civic pride—an important component in the overall perceived quality of life in our urban area.

The Greater Columbus Arts Council (GCAC) produces the Columbus Arts Festival. Through vision and leadership, advocacy and collaboration, GCAC supports art and advances the culture in the region. A catalyst for excellence and innovation, GCAC funds exemplary artists and arts organizations and provides programs, events and services of public value that educate and engage all audiences. Since the council was founded in 1973, GCAC has served as the city's official allocation agency for City of Columbus funding for the arts. In 2009, GCAC gave away nearly \$2.1 million in support to area cultural organizations. GCAC also provides technical, organizational and marketing assistance to arts organizations along with research and information to the community, support for city arts planning and arts-based community initiatives. Additionally, GCAC manages two arts education programs for adults and children with support from the Franklin County Commissioners. A national leader in its field, GCAC maintains high operating standards in all areas, including the Columbus Arts Festival.

One of the hallmarks of a successful large event such as the Columbus Arts Festival is that as it evolves and changes over time without those guiding it losing sight of what the event is at heart. In our case, we are a visual arts festival with the aim of giving the public an opportunity to meet artists one-on-one and hopefully discover an appreciation for art while having fun. Any changes or additions to the Festival are made to enhance the visual arts experience for those in attendance.

In years past, participating artists have given accolades to Columbus Arts Festival for its beautiful setting, friendly and knowledgeable crowds and fabulous volunteers. Friendly booth sitters, souvenir sellers and the hard working Coordinating Committee help give the Festival this stellar reputation. Not as visible are the many months of work by Festival volunteers that go into the planning of the event. GCAC is grateful for everyone's efforts, all year round, that make the Columbus Arts Festival consistently one of the best in the country!

Booth Sitters

Booth sitters are volunteers who will walk up and down the site helping out artists who might need a break from their booths. In your check in packet, you receive a plastic flag. This flag tied to your tent pole above your head will signal a booth sitter. Let your booth sitter know your expectations while you are gone: Ask customers to return in 15 minutes in order to make their purchase, etc.

Restrooms

Artist Lounge

New this year...located in the Loann Crane Center, First Floor, is an oasis for our Artists. Stop in, use the restrooms, cool down in the A/C, relax in the couch area, eat your lunch at one of the many tables, get out of the sun, grab a snack, and in the mornings come get your coffee served up fresh by our Artist Market Volunteers. This is also a place where you can provide Artist Market Volunteers feedback about your festival experience.

Security

Pick pockets and other professional thieves recognize large public events as opportunities to exploit unsuspecting people. Use precautions normally taken when traveling and participating in any outdoor event to protect your product, cash, and other belongings. Columbus Police Officers are on duty 24/7. Police Officers are always located at intersecting streets of the Festival. Artists are solely responsible for the security of their booths and equipment. The CAF staff recommends removal of all valuables from your booth each night as well as placing all displays and materials in a secure place.

Emergency Evacuation Plan

CAF staff wants everyone to be prepared in the event of an emergency. The Columbus Police will be on site at all times. The CAF Staff will have immediate communication with them. In the event of severe weather or emergency evacuation, follow police direction to take shelter in one of the campus buildings.

Weapons Policy

CAF prohibits the carrying of weapons while working, volunteering or participating in the Festival. Should the presence of a weapon be detected, the appropriate event and law enforcement personnel will be notified and asked to respond. Guests, if appropriately licensed, are permitted to carry concealed weapons. Anyone observed with a weapon should be reported to a Columbus Police Officer.

Lost and Found

Lost and Found is located at the festival headquarters at the Loann Crane Center at Cleveland and Gay Streets with the front door facing Gay Street, north of the "ART" sign.

Handicap Accessibility

CAF is dedicated to the preservation of the Americans with Disabilities Act. Every effort has been made to make all areas of the site accessible to all persons. Handicap parking is designated in the Spring Street Columbus State parking lot.

Sales Tax

Fire Extinguisher

Columbus Building Department requires all artists to have approved Fire Extinguishers.

Booth Requirements

10 x 10 FEET/10 x 20 FEET

Adequate space has been marked for your booth. Do not "leak over" in to your neighbor's space all booths are spray painted with your measurements. You will be asked to move your tent back in to its proper space if you extend past your space.

ELECTRICAL

Electrical Requirements will be given to every artist. Do not store/stack anything on any electrical cords running through your area. An electrical contractor will be coming through the festival verifying festival concerns about electrical issues.

NOTE: Non-Conforming connections, machinery, signage, equipment will be removed by Festival Staff at the Artist's expense.

Medium Categories

CERAMICS

Works created by original clay and porcelain other than jewelry. No machine made or mass produced work is permitted. If multiple pieces of the same design are displayed, each piece must be signed.

DRAWING

Works created using dry media including chalk, charcoal, pastels, pencil, wax crayons, etc., or from fluid medium of inks and washes applied by pen or brush.

FIBER

All works crafted from fibers including leather, paper, basketry, embroidery, weaving, tapestry and papermaking. Machine tooling, machine screened patterns or miscellaneous forms of mass production are NOT permitted. All factory produced wearable items, regardless of additional modification or enhancement by the artists, are not allowed.

GLASS

Glass works may be functional or purely decorative in design. Works that have been crafted via glass-blowing, molding or casting, as well as work that been kiln-formed. Works must be etched or engraved. No form of mass production is permitted.

JEWELRY

All jewelry whether the work is produced from metal, glass, clay, fiber, paper, plastic or other materials.

PAINTING

Works created in oils, acrylics, watercolor, etc.

PHOTOGRPAHY

Photographic prints made from artist's original negative that have been processed by the artist under his/her direct supervision. Photographers are required to disclose their creative process and printing process.

PRINTMAKING

Printed works for which the artist hand-manipulated the plates, stones or screens. Prints must be numbered as a limited edition. Printmakers are required to disclose their creative process and printing process.

SCULPTURE

Three-dimensional original work created in any medium.

WOOD

Original works in wood that are hand tooled, machine worked, turned or carved.

2D MIXED MEDIA

Two-dimensional works that incorporate more than one type of physical material in their production.

3D MIXED MEDIA

Three-dimensional works that incorporate more than one type of physical material in their production.

Displaying Your Work

Your exhibited art must be original and your own creation. No use of commercial kits or molds. Please cooperate on all Festival rules, which were outlined in your prospectus. The CAF Artist Market Committee will be visiting each booth throughout the festival to review content and adherence to guidelines.

The following must be displayed at all times:

- Exhibitor's name
- Exhibitor's logo (if applicable)
- Biographical information
- Artist statement
- Business cards
- Information about gallery representation in the Columbus area (if applicable)

Art Guidelines: What type of art can artists display and sell?

- Only works of art created by the artist accepted as an exhibitor at the CAF
- Only works of art in the medium category(s) into which the artist was accepted
- Only works of art that are comparable in size, style and quality to the work pictures in the slides submitted for jury process
- Artists must limit their reproductions to 25% of booth work
- Work of individuals other than those accepted and specified in the artists application for entry may not be exhibited or advertised in the CAF

Artist Statement

- Required artists statement must be placed in a prominent place within each booth
- Artists statement must define "reproduction" or "limited edition"
- Individual pieces must be labeled with these definitions if they have been reproduced or are part of a limited edition

Reproductions

- Reproductions of two-dimensional work are permitted.
- Each piece must be labeled "REPRODUCTION" (not "print"), limited to signed editions of 250.
- No hand-colored reproductions are permitted.
- Reproductions are an auxiliary part of the artist's display—framed reproduction. Reproductions may be displayed on one wall of the booth not to exceed ten linear feet.
- All unframed reproductions must be displayed in a browse bin.

What is not permitted?

- The CAF reserves the right to exclude from exhibition the sale of any non-conforming work as determined by the Artist Market Committee and/or the Executive Director
- All decisions made by the Festival Director are final
- Sales of postcards, note cards, mouse pads and other similar reproductions
- Collaborating artists may exhibit only their collaborating work(s)

Booth Signage

The festival will provide you with a display sign stating your name, hometown and booth #. Use the provided Zip ties in your check in packet to adhere your sign to your booth pole.

Deadline for Booth Signs: Noon on Friday is the last time we can take edits/changes to your sign. Notify an Artist Market member for any sign issues.

CAF wants you to feel free to post “no smoking” signage in your booth.
